Eschatological Teaching of Revelation (13)

The Dragon and two beasts represent a counterfeit Trinity. "The dragon seeks worship that belongs only to God. The first beast seeks to rule the world, which is Jesus Christ's prerogative. The second beast glorifies the first beast, which is a counterfeit of the Holy Spirit's ministry of glorifying Christ."4
