I. The versions we have used here

- A. What is a 'version'? A translation
- B. Can translation render words *exactly* from one language to another? No
- C. If someone says one version is the only one that should be used, what does that make that version? Incapable of error -i.e., inerrant
- D. Does the Bible address versions at all? Not really

IV. The difficulty in changing from one version to another

- A. Tradition!
- B. All versions have strengths and weaknesses
- C. It is difficult to get the whole church to switch to one standard version
 - 1. It is advantageous to 'all be on the same page'
 - 2. But we all have different likes and dislikes
